Save a Bear SECURE YOUR TRASH

It's the law!

To protect wildlife, residents and guests, trash regulations are enforced across the Estes Valley. There are different rules for homes and businesses -- read on to see what options are best for you!



AT HOME

For vacation rental homes and other businesses, see opposite page.

Option 1: Place trash outside on pickup days in a standard hard-sided container between 6 a.m. and 7 p.m. only.

Option 2: Use a wildlife-resistant container if you need to set trash outside any time other than between 6 a.m. and 7 p.m. on pick-up day.

Hard-sided containers are not required for bags of unscented waste like yard clippings.



BIRD FEEDERS (IN TOWN LIMITS)

All feeders, including hummingbird feeders, must be suspended out of reach or otherwise inaccessible to bears when they are active, April through November.


It's the law!



AT YOUR BUSINESS, VACATION RENTAL OR SPECIAL EVENT:

Option 1: When storing trash or grease outside, you must use a wildlife-resistant container or enclosure at all times.

Option 2: You can store trash in non-wildlife-resistant containers 95 gallons or less if emptied daily by 10 p.m. or contracted for overnight pickup.
