Colorado Resource Portal For Veterans

Colorado Veteran's Resource Portal was built with veterans in mind by both veterans and civilians working together. The idea, main design, and execution can be credited to the hard work of the volunteers at Veteran's Passport To Hope (VP2H). Guidance and input from veterans was taken into account and we've created this site, which, we hope, will help veterans in the state of Colorado.

The reason we have created this portal is to help veterans in Colorado find all of the free resources available to them. When Shane Schmutz, a three-time Operation Iraqi Freedom veteran and the Founder of VP2H began organizing a large veteran based fund-raising event in 2011, he began networking within the Colorado veteran community. What he and his team found through networking was that a lot of people and organizations existed solely to help veterans. As a veteran himself, Shane was surprised that he was unaware of the multiple resources available. Shane and his board members wanted all veterans to know about ALL of the resources without having to spend thousands of hours networking. They wanted the information easily available and accessible at veteran's fingertips. Shane's team did additional research and discovered that many individuals within the state, the Colorado state government, and veteran focused donors also wanted to create a way to compile all of the available information and resources.

- This website focuses on listing resources that are available to veterans 100% free of charge.
- This website focuses primarily on resources which are available through non-profits who are Colorado based or have a Colorado based office.
- Every resource listed can be rated by actual veterans who have utilized services of the organizations listed on this portal. We encourage you to submit a rating (1-5 stars) as well as leave comments to support your star-rating. We at VP2H have done our best to ensure that only honest, hard-working, and caring resources have been listed; although, we're not perfect. We believe that the best way to vet-out available resources is by veterans themselves rating the organizations and by sharing their experiences (both positive and negative) via the "star rating" and "comment" option.
- Every decision that is made in regard to this website is done with the veteran in mind. We at VP2H believe that the veteran ALWAYS comes first and we make all of our decisions based off of that single philosophy.
- At VP2H, we strive to utilize donations in the most efficient manner possible. We make every spending decision with a frugal thought process, keeping both the donor's intent and the veteran

VP2H's mission consists of three main focus areas:

Awareness, Fund Raising, and Cooperation.

AWARENESS: VP2H's Primary mission is to raise awareness within the Colorado area about the issues Veterans face: Multiple tours in combat zones, Post-Traumatic Stress Disorder (PTSD), Traumatic Brain Injury (TBI), high unemployment rate, high homelessness rate, high divorce rate, and a record high suicide rate. As the military mission winds down in Iraq and Afghanistan and veterans reintegrate themselves into civilian society, we believe that this awareness will foster an understanding of their efforts and compassion for their struggle.

FUNDRAISING: Through due diligence and research, we organize fund raising events which support local, Veteran friendly non-profits. We only support high quality charities that maximize their accountability to veteran's causes and are transparent in their fund raising and giving practices.

COOPERATION: VP2H's tertiary mission is to act as a rallying point for other veteran friendly non-profits. Our goal is to organize and conduct meetings with the leadership teams of these groups within the Colorado area with the goal of finding ways for us to work together more efficiently. We believe that by working together and by sharing ideas, we can reduce competition between non-profit groups and more efficiently and more effectively help veterans.
