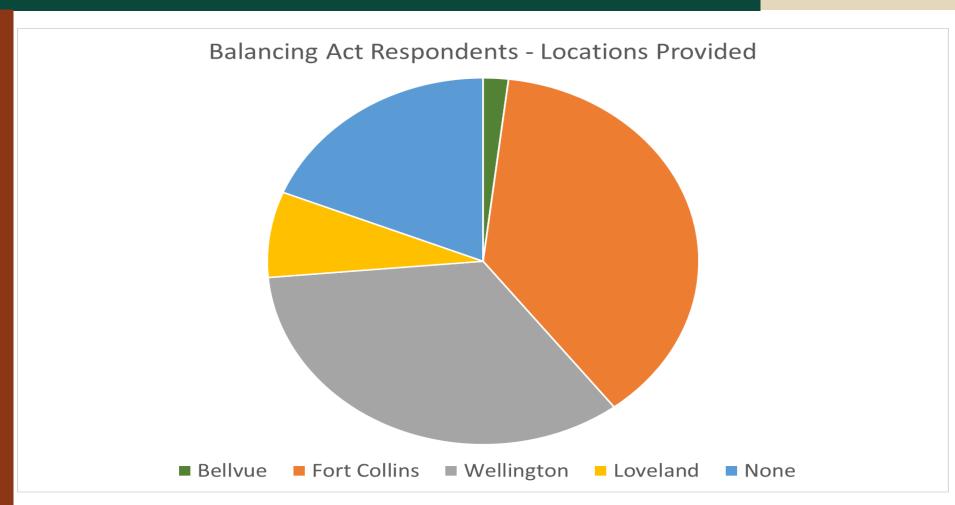

Regional Outreach approach:

- 1. Regional outreach plan that prioritizes historically under-resourced communities
- 2. Identify short-term response and recovery priorities, in which funding is a barrier, that ARPA can potentially address by 2024.
- 3. Understand the COVID-19 impacts and long-term recovery and resilience priorities from the community beyond what is considered ARPA-eligible to develop a shared understanding across sectors of how to better collaborate for future community resiliency-focused work.

 - Payroll \$1,979,373 (recyclable)
 - Revenue reduction \$831,312 (recyclable)
 - Vicarious trauma & Sheriff medical \$125,028
 - Administration \$5,024



REPORT UPDATE

Reports from August 31, 2021

- Proposal: utilize \$2M recycled funds for CJS shortfall
- Submitted the reports early, on August 30.
 Anticipated that the Treasury portal would have technical difficulties, which they did.



IT Potential Partnership projects

\$1.3M: Partnership with Poudre Valley Rural Electric (PVREA) to install fiber optic cables between Livermore and Red Feather Lakes area.

- \$2.6M project; cost split with PVRE
- Obtain 1/2 of the fiber strands to serve future fiber to home projects serving up to 4,300 premises in the area.
- Middle mile project required to bring connectivity to those unserved communities.
- PVREA currently budgeting and is unable to pull the fiber without our participation.
- PVREA will use the connection to upgrade connections to the electrical grid, SKADA systems and remote surveillance of the substations.

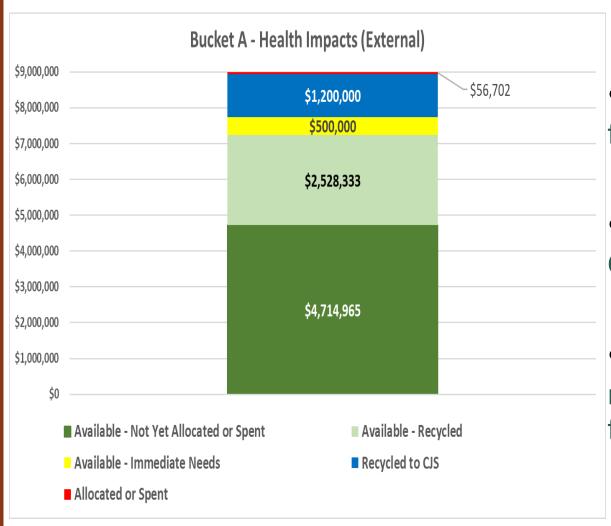


IT Potential Partnership projects

\$250,000 to Loveland Pulse to complete and expand broadband services to Drake.

- Project costs higher than grant award received from Big Thompson School District
- Pulse willing to add connectivity to Sylvan Dale guest ranch and adjacent homes (approx. 60 additional residences).

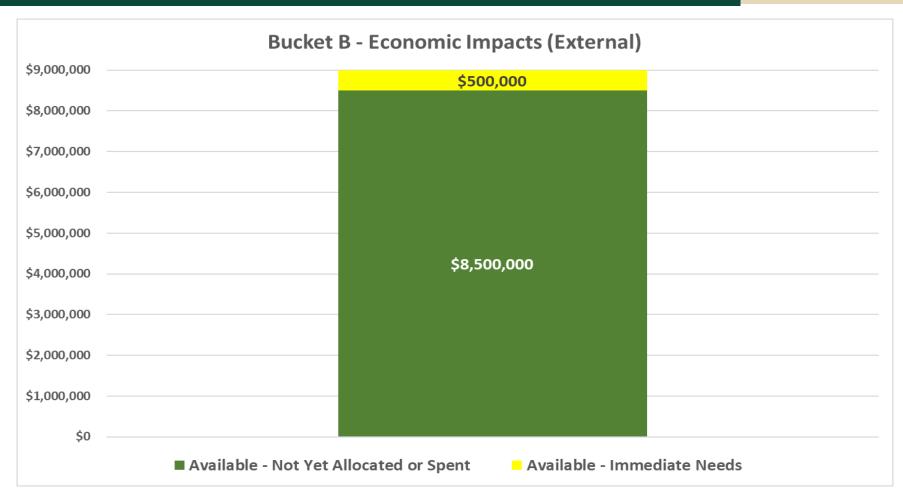




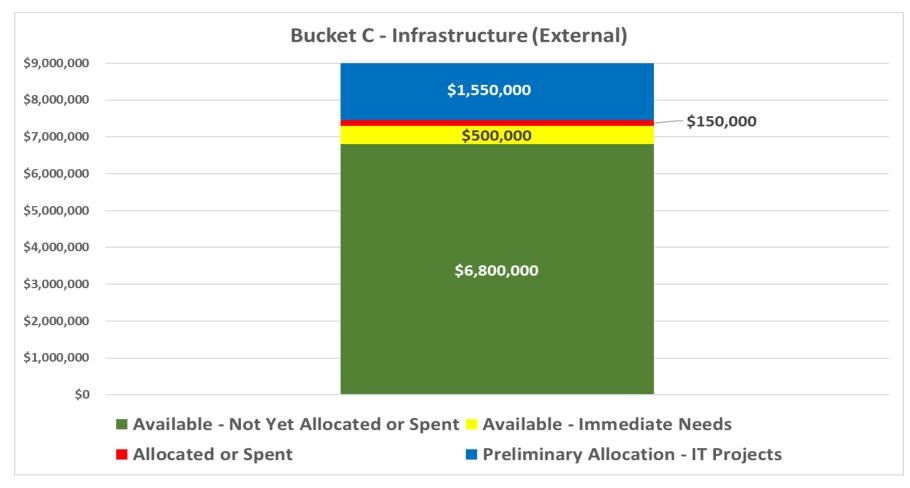
•\$1.2 million recycled funds to CJS shortfall

- Est. \$3.7 million total recyclable payroll costs for 2021

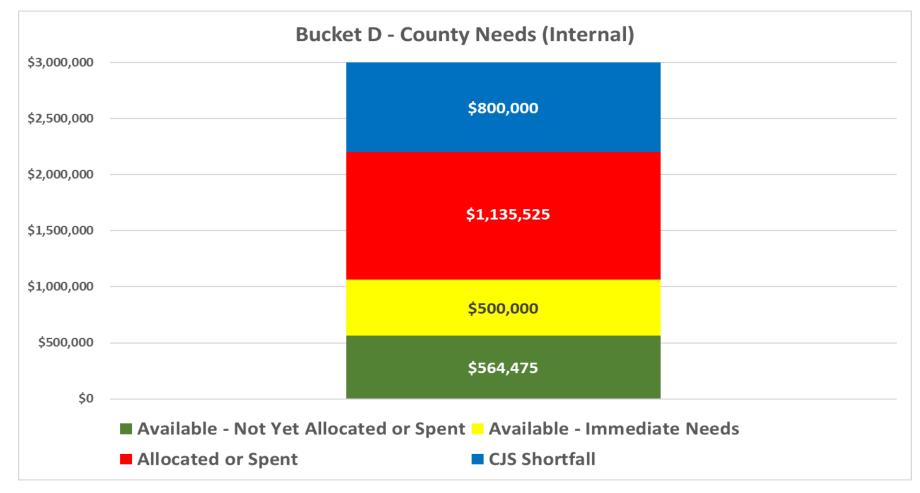




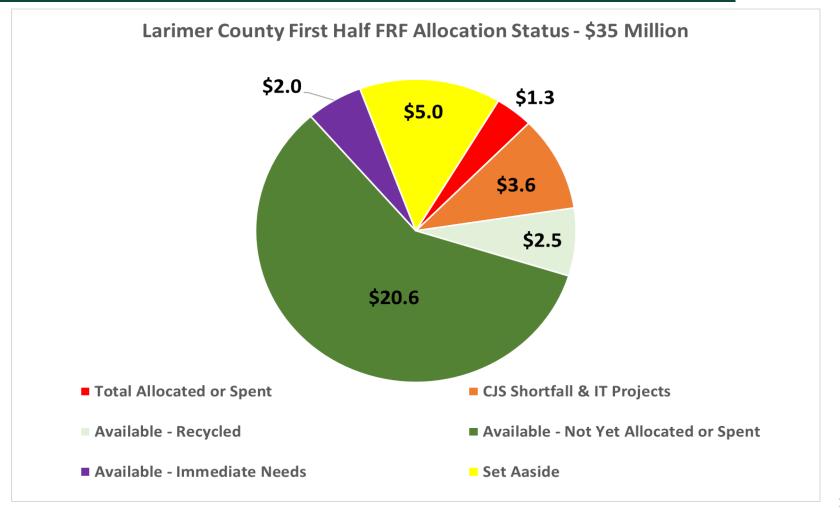














NEXT STEPS
