### **Position Overview:**

Traffic Control Monitors provide crucial support to LCDNR Rangers by assisting with the coordination of traffic flow at South Bay boat ramp. Ensure visitors enjoy their day by guiding vehicles to appropriate parking, answering questions, encouraging stewardship, and keeping operations running smoothly.

### **Duties:**

- Attend your station at the south ramp, stopping traffic to allow boats in & out of the ramp
- Facilitate the queue for the north ramp when the south ramp is at capacity
- Direct one-way traffic
- Direct visitors to the swim beach and passenger vehicle parking
- Communicate with staff lead via radio
- Represent Larimer County in a friendly and professional manner
- Prepared to work outside
- Familiarize yourself with the reservoir and frequently asked visitor questions

### **Schedule:**

- Shifts are 10:00 am – 1:00 pm & 1:00 pm – 4:00 pm on Saturdays, Sundays, and holidays, Memorial Day weekend – Labor Day weekend
- Traffic Control Monitors must volunteer for at least four shifts per season
- Training will be held in late May
- Attend a New Volunteer Orientation

### **Qualifications:**

- Enjoy talking with people and good communication skills
- Ability to work outside and to stand for a few hours
- Passion for our reservoirs and encouraging visitors to be good stewards
- Friendly, courteous, outgoing, patient, and flexible
- Ability to not take things personally
- Comfortable managing self and working in an independent volunteer role
- Boating experience a plus but not required
- Understanding and acceptance of the potential risks for this volunteer position such as inclement weather, heat, encounters with wildlife such as insects and rattlesnakes, and unpleasant interactions with the public
