## **About the Larimer County Conservation Corps:**

The Larimer County Conservation Corps (LCCC) promotes individual development through service for the benefit of our environment and community. Our programs empower corpsmembers to develop personal and professional skills, gain environmental awareness and actively engage in the community, while developing self-sufficiency to help them become productive members of our community. The LCCC is based in Fort Collins, Colorado and is an accredited corps through the Colorado Youth Corps Association and The Corps Network.

# **Position Summary:**

The RMNP Fall Corpsmember position is a seasonal role performing various construction projects in Rocky Mountain National Park. Projects will include exterior and interior finishing work, including painting, trim work, cabinet installation, landscaping, decking, and a variety of flooring. Corpsmembers are engaged in a combination of hands-on projects and service learning activities focused on personal and professional skill development. Corpsmembers participate in 18 weeks of service.

#### Schedule:

LCCC crew leaders are expected to work 8:00 a.m. – 4:30 p.m. Monday through Friday. Corpsmembers stay in RMNP staff housing with the crew leaders Monday through Friday, throughout the season. Corpsmembers have no crew obligations on weekends. Please note that crews will not work the week of December 24 – 31 or federal holidays. This schedule may be modified due to training, weather, logistics, or other unforeseen circumstances as needed.

## **Duties and Responsibilities:**

- Complete various building projects and finishing work on the interior and exterior of park housing facilities
- Adhere to safe and proper use of various tools and equipment
- Actively participate in daily safety discussions
- Participate in personal and professional development activities including team building, service learning, and workshops
- Adhere to the Larimer County Conservation Corps policies and procedures
- Be prepared each day with uniform, work boots, raingear, water bottles, daypack, lunch and snacks
- Report directly to program coordinator

# **Training will include:**

- LCCC policies and procedures
- Site safety, tool and equipment use and safety
- First Aid/CPR Certifications
- Career pathway development
- Basic construction and finish work

#### **Qualifications:**

- Must be between 18 and 25 years old at the start date of the season
- Committed to completing the fall program in its entirety
- Ability to remain focused, alert, and productive in difficult working conditions and perform physical labor
- Must be dedicated to Larimer County Conservation Corps' mission
- Team oriented, punctual, and dependable with a strong work ethic
- Interest in making a difference in the community
- If selected, required to verify identity and eligibility to work in the United States

# **Physical Requirements:**

#### Must have:

- Acceptable eyesight, including clear near and far vision, good depth perception
- Adequate hearing to perform job function
- Appropriate voice skills to be clearly understood on the telephone and in public contacts
- Fine and gross motor skills and use of arms, hands, and fingers to perform computer duties and operate equipment

#### Must be able to:

- Exert up to 50 lbs. of force occasionally, and/or up to 20 lbs. of force frequently, and/or up to 10 lbs. of force constantly to move objects
- Climb, balance, stoop, kneel, crouch, crawl, and reach frequently or constantly

### **Environmental Conditions and Physical Surroundings:**

Exposure to variable weather conditions, noise, dust and airborne particles
