Regulation of oil and gas is certainly the most important issue facing our community, and it is owed to citizens (current and future) to do it correctly with safety and conservation in mind. I would like to help shape the regulations that will hopefully sustain a harmonious and thriving community. I am a physician and patient advocate, citizen of this county/state and a mother. I have a strong interest in the impact of oil and gas on the individual level, community level and for future generations. As an obstetrician, I harbor many concerns about the impact of these activities on a pregnancy and in childhood and would like to play a role in continuing to keep my patients and family members safe.

I am committed to safe and responsible development of the county's resources. Oil and gas production has been a part of Larimer County for almost 100 years and I believe my industry can and should make accommodations to continue to protect county residents and be good neighbors.

Being a Weld County employee, I have daily experience in balancing the needs of the oil and gas industry with those of the neighbors, realizing they both have a right to exist and that both owe each other health, safety and welfare. I am a Larimer County resident and property owner, so I care about how oil and gas issues are handled in my home county as well as my work county.

I have worked on oil and gas wells in Larimer County for 35 years and have raised a family around these wells. For the last twenty years my company has operated oil and gas wells in Colorado, working with stakeholders and complying with state and local regulations. In 2014 I worked with the Loveland Energy Action Project, conducting town meetings and information sessions describing how my industry conducts operations and how those operations can safely proceed in proximity to our homes and businesses.

I drafted the pipeline regulations for the City of Fort Lupton and the Town of Keenesburg before I worked for Weld County. With Weld County, I was on the team that led the Pipeline Working Group that included representatives from all of our oil and gas producers, several local landowners, representatives from municipalities and county employees. I currently permit several kinds of oil and gas related facilities and businesses. I permit subdivisions and structure placement with regard to oil and gas setbacks. I'm also a certified floodplain manager and permit all the pipelines and oil and gas facilities that cross floodplains, enforcing environmentally responsible interaction with our floodplains.

The state of Colorado has fairly comprehensive regulations for oil and gas administered by the Oil & Gas Conservation Commission and the Colorado Department of Health and Environment. I believe that local regulations can be most useful if they concentrate on local land use issues that may not be adequately regulated by the state. Examples include setbacks, fugitive dust, lighting, and noise.

My public health background has exposed me to the kinds of issues that oil and gas production bring to a community. I am familiar with the state of Colorado's regulations pertaining to air and water quality, and with local land use regulations.

In my previous work at Larimer County, I have participated in reviewing state air quality regulations regarding emissions from oil and gas operations. This included efforts where the County Commissioners supported the adoption of state-wide emission regulations related to oil and gas operations by the state's Air Quality Control Commission.

As an attorney, my practice has focused on the oil and gas industry for the last 5 years. This is an area in which I have created a niche focus. I moved to Fort Collins at the end of December 2018 from southern Indiana, where I routinely represented oil and gas operators in Illinois, Indiana, and Kentucky. I have extensive experience with various state and local oil and gas regulations, and advising clients regarding those regulations. I understand the need to balance facilitating oil and gas development, while doing so in a way that protects and promotes responsible development with appropriate regard for the environment and those people who live and work around oil and gas development.

I am an active developer within the Northern Colorado area. I serve on multiple metropolitan district boards, own two golf courses, and have built ten thousand lots. My goal in applying for this position is to help the state and local communities work towards reasonable compromises. Not just in set backs, but also in assessing where suitable locations for oil and gas facilities should be.

I have forty years of experience in real estate. I have thirty years of experience developing in Colorado. In 2008, I purchased the oldest coal company in the state, The Rocky Mountain Fuel Company, to grow my business and protect my developments. I understand the economics of the oil and gas industry as an owner, the effects on real estate as a developer, and the effects on our community as a home owner and citizen. This is an opportunity that I would take very seriously due to the impact that it has had and will have on our community in the coming years.

I was a Member of the Appraisal Institute for twenty years, but have since become engrained in Northern Colorado's development and expansion.

My primary interest related to Oil and Gas regulations is ensuring a fair and balanced approach in regulating the oil and gas industry, and ensuring that all viewpoints are considered in creating a common sense approach to regulating a necessary and viable industry in Colorado. I would like to become a member of the Task Force as I bring a variety of experience to the table, including legal, policy, industry, and landowner experience.

As a 12+ year oil and gas attorney I have represented the interests of both companies and land owners in several oil and gas related matters. Representing these types of clients has required me to negotiate opposing interests and work towards reasonable solutions to difficult problems. I have a deep understanding of the interplay between the industry's desire to develop a resource and a landowner's desire to protect the interests of their property and their health. I also bring several years of policy drafting and legislative experience through my experience as an attorney, and as a past policy analyst and lobbyist for DORA. I have experience negotiating regulations with a wide variety of stakeholders and ensuring that regulations are drafted in a clear and precise manner. Anadarko is one of the largest mineral owners and the largest oil and gas producer in the State. I actively work in a team environment daily. I participate on an executive committee in my business with multiple members of the team with differing experience and views.

For many years I have worked with landowners to craft mutually beneficial surface use agreements that protect landowners rights and still provide for responsible resource development. It is important to ascertain all parties requirements and make sufficient accommodations such that operations can proceed safely and with a minimum of disturbance. If enough time is spent to determine the relevant issues there are usually concessions both sides are able to make to get to an acceptable solution.

Before coming to Weld County, my primary role was updating comprehensive plans and zoning codes for small towns. This involved setting up community engagement opportunities and leading several focus group and advisory committees.

I have been involved with interpreting and working within the framework of zoning and land use regulations mostly in Larimer and Weld counties all my working life, both rural as well as within most of the Cities and town limits.

Mostly Bank Board and sub groups on water right issues. Having successfully closed over 800 natural resource transactions involving Land, Minerals, Water, Open Space and Commercial Real Estate hopefully has given me the wisdom of consensus through the process of compromise which is critical for the majority of all successful outcomes that are perceived as win/win.

I have been instrumental in the placement and development of nearly forty oil rigs and nearly two hundred wells throughout communities in Northern Colorado. While I am familiar with current regulations, most of my experience comes from the land owner side. This is usually one the placement of the oil pads, specifically regarding how to minimize their impact on current and future development within a community.

Yes. I am the president of five metropolitan boards composed of approximately thirty districts and four thousand residents. I work through problems on a daily basis.

As a policy analyst and lobbyist for the Colorado Department of Regulatory Agencies, and as a legal intern for Senator Wayne Allard, I actively contributed to several pieces of legislation for the regulation of multiple occupations and programs in the State of Colorado. Additionally, as a member of Colorado Farm Bureau, I worked on several policies related to land use as they relate to farmers and ranchers.

As stated above, my experience includes working on several boards such as Weld County Farm Bureau and the Larimer County Republican Party, as well as working with several clients with opposing viewpoints, working on draft legislation with several different stakeholders, and working with legislators of differing political viewpoints to negotiate terms favorable to all sides.

I have a long and productive track record working on local and state regulatory agencies as well as industry committees representing a wide range of stakeholders. I have served as the chair of the Colorado Oil and Gas Associations local government committee and have represented Anadarko and industry on several local and state rulemaking committees. I am comfortable with working with individuals and organizations representing a broad range of viewpoints. I recently participated in a stakeholder group consisting of members of the oil and gas industry, the Colorado Association of School Boards, the League of Oil and Gas Impacted Coloradans and the Colorado Oil and Gas Conservation Commission to draft new COGCC rules for school setbacks.
