

# We Want You to Represent Us

- Deny Glade Reservoir
  - Geologically Unstable
  - Lack of Water
  - Financial risk to Larimer County
- Deny Northern Tier Pipeline/ Worse than Thornton
  - Assessment of Alternatives did not consider Poudre River or Swaps
  - Faulty analysis favored Private Property over existing rights of way and Easements
  - NISP approval undermines case with Thornton
  - Frees up to \$75 Million for improving Poudre conveyance
  - No benefit with all the burden to Northern Larimer County
  - Deny use of Imminent Domain
  - Application fails to list the property owners

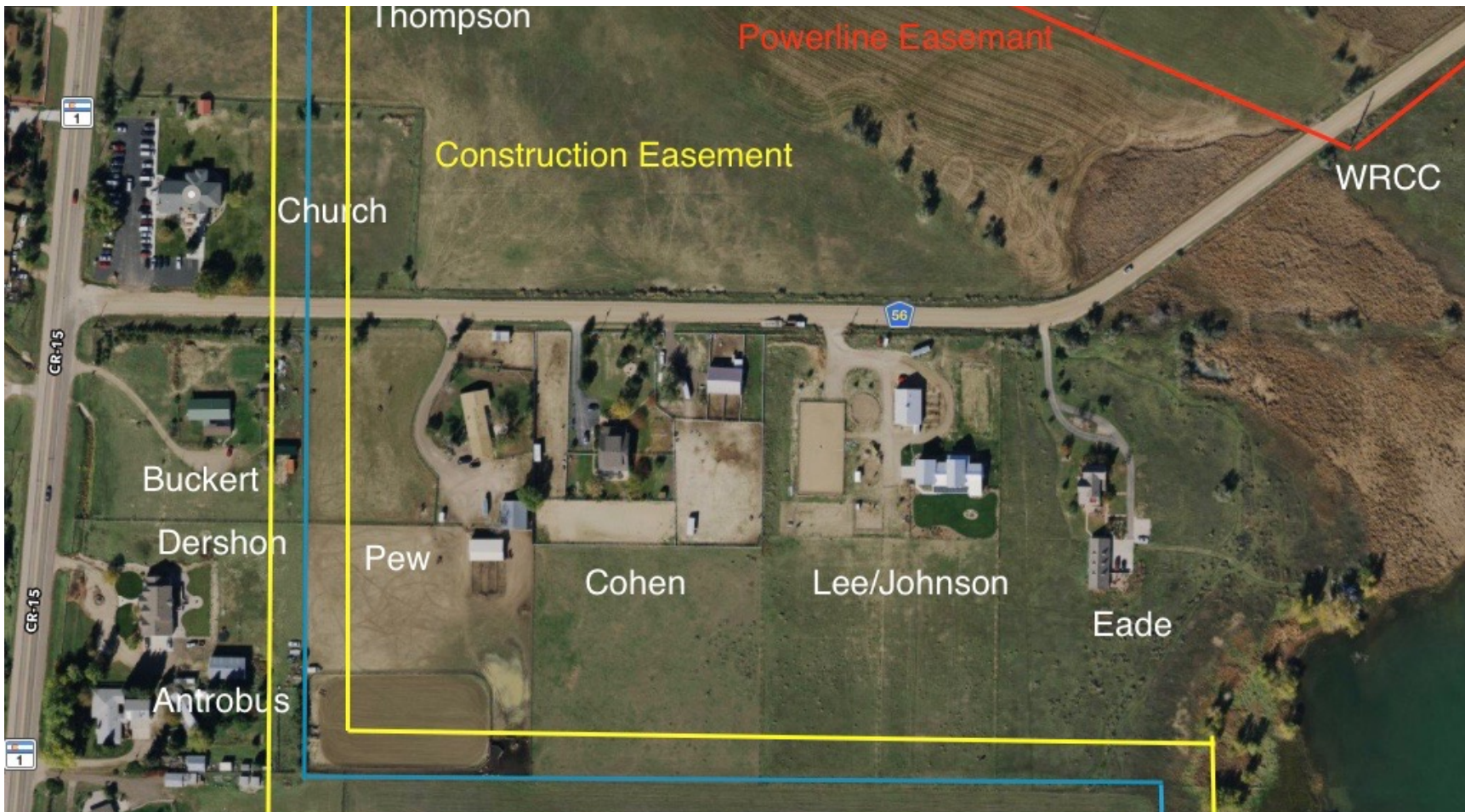

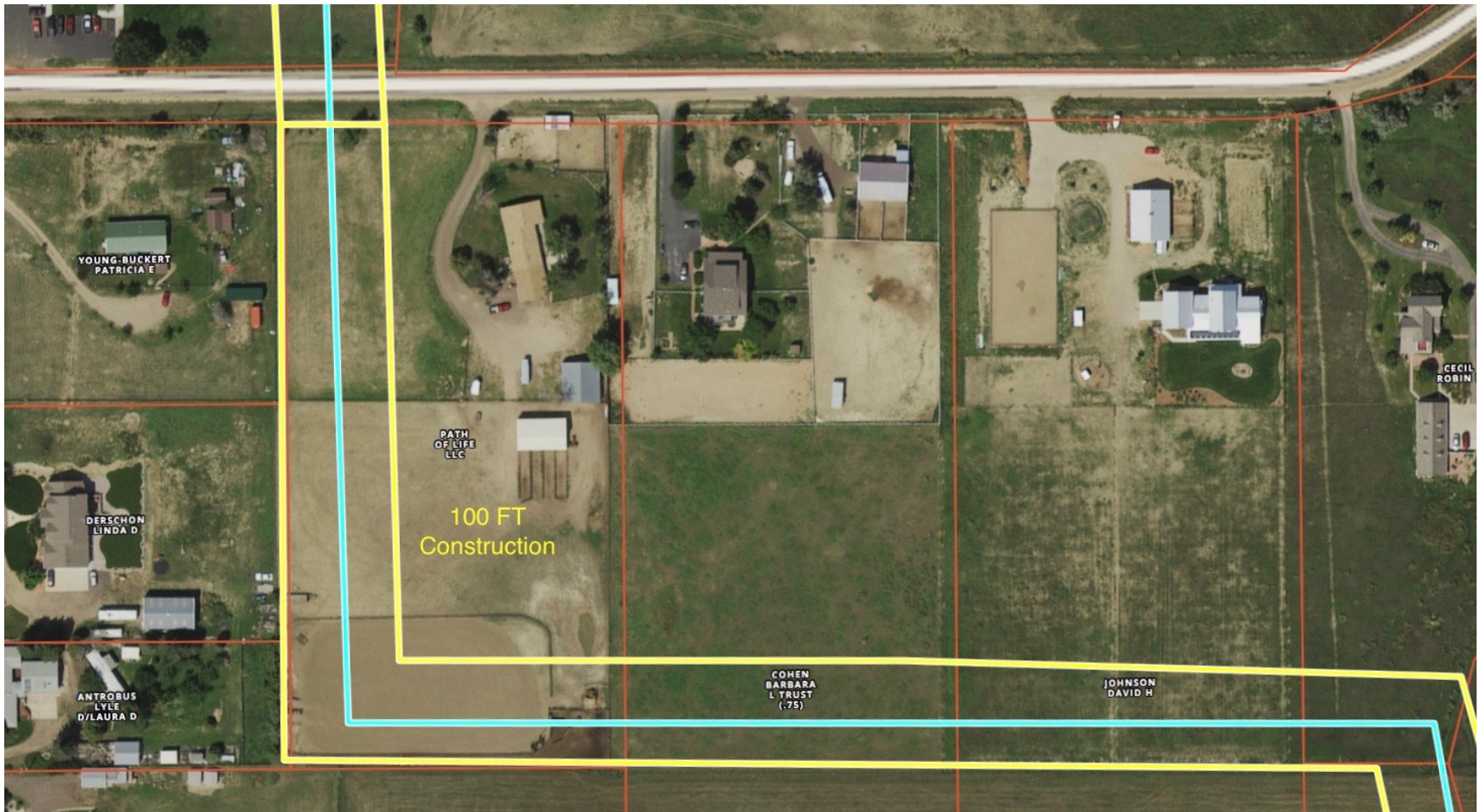


# Proposed Route in Application

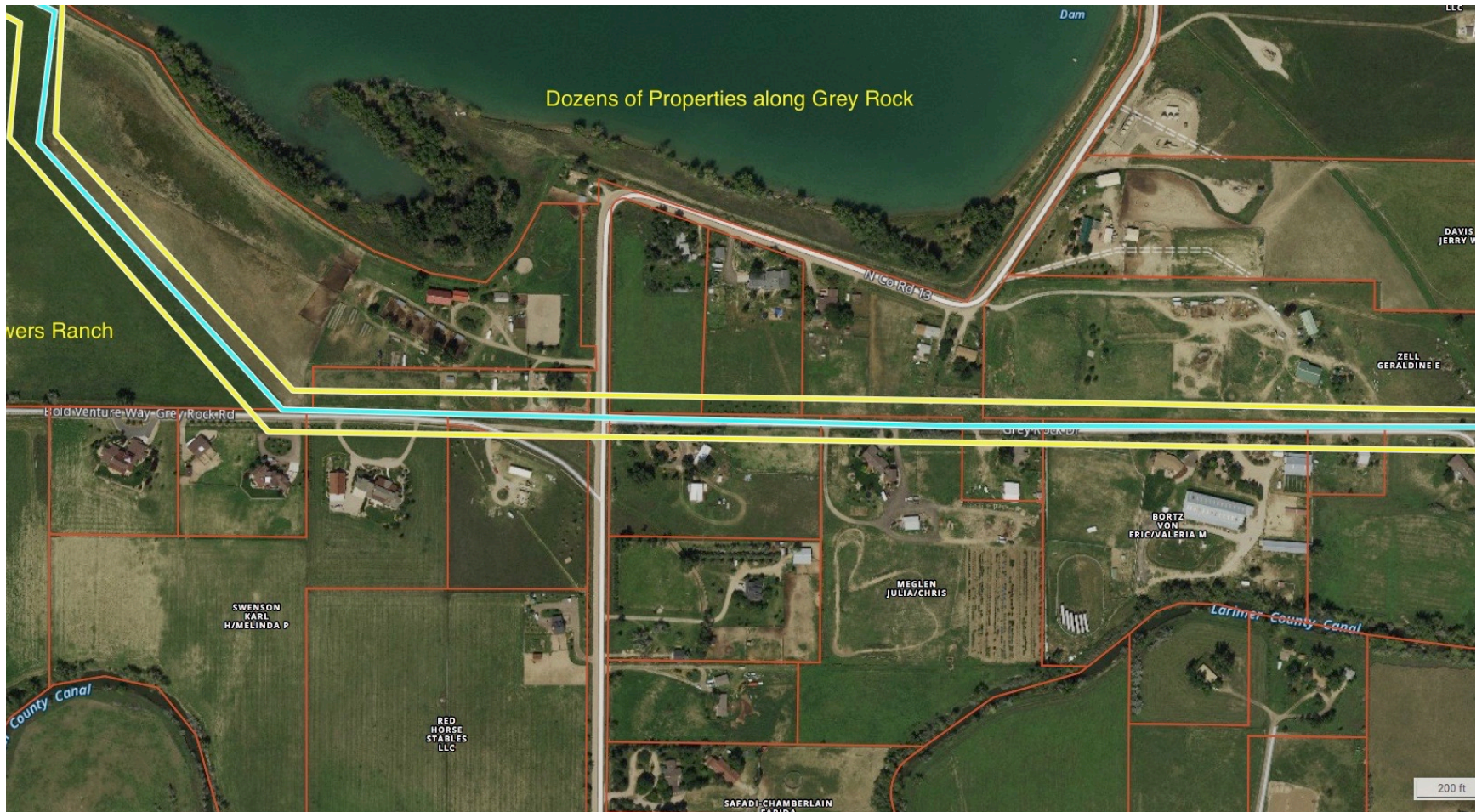

# If Glade is approved, the Poudre River is the best conveyance choice

If Northern Tier Pipeline is approved:

- Must use existing Power Line and CR56 ROW
- HW 287 must be moved and successfully reopened prior to pursuing easements and beginning pipeline construction
- True co-location of all pipelines i.e. same easement same trench, same construction period in Power Line & CR56 ROW
- County to ensure NISP compliance so residents don't have to file injunctions if NISP fails to perform.
- No Imminent Domain
- Even with all the above parameters, NISP route is NO better than Denied Thornton Pipeline
