COVID DASHBOARD

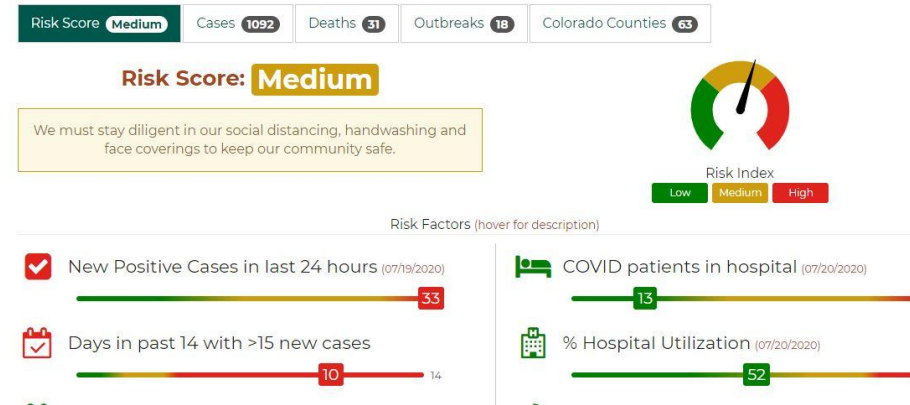
9 Active outbreaks in our community

Testing has increased across the county, and we're seeing the highest numbers at our community testing site and the longest delay in results (since the very beginning).

Contact tracing efforts have increased to keep up with the rise in cases.

Complaints have increased substantially in the last couple weeks.

We are starting to see outbreaks tied to tournament play in sports.



VARIANCE UPDATE

- We were contacted by state Friday afternoon about the need for a mitigation plan.
- This was due to the increased case counts which made us achieve one of our early warning indicators.
- Mitigation plan was submitted by deadline of noon on Monday.
- Next step is to wait to see whether state requires changes or whether we move forward with 2 weeks of monitoring.
- Meeting with towns and law enforcement about consistent messages and support for education and enforcement.
