Notice More

- 1. Size: ½ inch, 1 inch, 3 inches (use a ruler for reference)
- 2. Sound: Making a noise? Describe what it sounds like?
- 3. Shape: Long, oval, round, has wings?
- 4. Patterns: Light/dark, bold/faint, outrageous, spots?
- 5. Habitat: Where are they?
- 6. Is it not an insect? (Sider, centipede, roly-poly, etc.)
- 7. What else can you notice?

What makes an insect an insect?

6 legs, 3 body parts, compound eyes, 4 wings (at some stage of life), they lay eggs. Otherwise it may be a spider or other type of bug.
