Managing your health with preventive medications

By taking preventive medications as told by your provider, you may avoid serious illness and high health care costs. Your pharmacy benefit plan includes special coverage to help make preventive medications more affordable. These drugs can protect against or manage a medical condition, such as:

- Preventing blood clots and reducing the risk of a stroke.
- Preventing heart disease and reducing high blood pressure.
- Preventing osteoporosis (a disease that leads to an increased risk of bone fracture).

Special coverage for preventive medications

The drugs on your plan's preventative medication list are free. This mean you'll pay nothing for these medications.

To check the cost of any medication, call the number on your member ID card, visit your plan's website on your member ID card, or log on to the OptumRx app.

Quality drives our decisions

To create these lists, OptumRx is guided by the Pharmacy and Theraputics Committee. This group of doctors and pharmacist reviews medications and coverage under pharmacy benefit plans. They also suggest which medications should be on your plan's preventive medications list.
