CIRT Investigation Update

Additional information is available about the Loveland officer-involved shooting that occurred at Tennessee Street on August 16.

Just before 7 p.m., a person in the home called 911 and requested police assistance for a male family member who was experiencing a mental health crisis and actively damaging the home.

A Loveland Police officer responded and made verbal contact with the man, identified as Alexander Domina, 19, of Loveland. Domina was in the backyard and armed with a knife when police arrived. A confrontation occurred, during which Domina moved forward and the officer fired his duty weapon, striking the man. Additional officers arrived on scene, secured the knife, and began rendering aid until medical crews arrived. Domina was transported to Medical Center of the Rockies and remains in their care.

The 8th Judicial District Critical Incident Response Team (CIRT) is conducting an investigation led by Fort Collins Police Services detectives. Under the CIRT protocol, the lead investigative agency is responsible for releasing any case-related information. The involved agency is limited to release of personnel information, as well as general information such as agency training, programs, and policies.

“We care deeply about the accuracy and integrity of critical incident investigations,” said District Attorney Gordon McLaughlin. “I understand that our community wants information, and I’m confident that the CIRT team’s diligent and professional work will produce a report that provides a full picture of what happened and provide the transparency the community deserves.”
